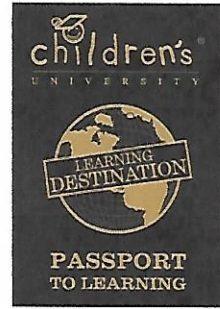




# HA'PENNY PIER VISITORS CENTRE
